Dear colleagues,

This is our second annual report of the Beacon Orthopedic Collaborative Care Program. The collaboration includes surgeons from Beacon Bone & Joint Specialists and Orthopedic & Sports Medicine Center of Northern Indiana, Inc. We are excited to share with you a summary of the outstanding developments, programs and highlights of the 2020-2021 performance period. During the last few years, this program has developed into a high-performing program providing standardized orthopedic care related to total joint replacements, hip fracture and orthopedic trauma care across Beacon Health System.

The goal of our program has always been about improving both quality and patient experience while reducing cost of care. Last year, we set and achieved three goals:

- Reduced care variation among providers by implementing evidence-based care with the use of fascia iliaca blocks (a local anesthetic) to reduce pain for hip fracture patients.
- 2. Incorporated robotic surgery with cutting-edge technology (ROSA robotic system) for knee replacement surgery.
- 3. Earned Advanced Certification for Total Joint Replacement programs by The Joint Commission for both Elkhart General Hospital and Memorial Hospital.

While you will see significant improvement last year in a number of key quality initiatives, we cannot underestimate the impact that COVID-19 had on disrupting the care of all patients at the hospital level. Because of bed shortages, elective procedures at times were put on hold, resulting in our decreased volumes and shifting from what was once an overnight procedure for total joint replacement to discharging most patients the same day of surgery. Our teams were nimble and adjusted accordingly to meet the needs of our patients, families and communities.

I'm proud of the work and outcomes that this group of dedicated providers has helped Beacon Health System achieve for the orthopedic service line. Our focus is on improving the quality of patient care, and I'm pleased to share that one hundred percent of the performance metrics showed positive trending between 2020 and 2021. We identified \$291,000 in cost savings for the health system as a result of total knee and total hip implant cost-reduction efforts. Memorial's Comprehensive Care for Joint Replacement model (CJR) Bundle Payment program continues to perform well in its last year of the CMS program, resulting in reconciliation payment of \$516,550. Patient satisfaction remains strong at 4.9 on a 5.0 scale for our total joint replacement nursing units who care for that patient population.

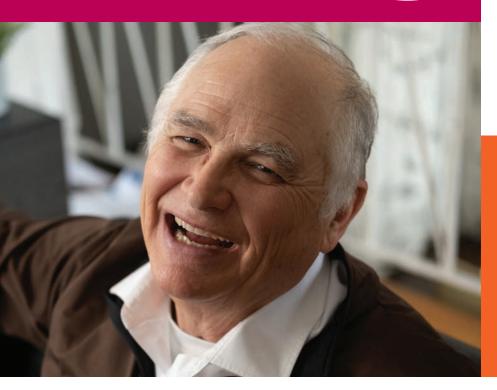

Martin — keeping life moving after degenerative knee pain and osteoarthritis

Ten years ago, Martin had knee replacement surgery, an ordeal that required him to take four months off from work. This year, at age 71, Martin needed a knee replacement for his other knee.

"I was interested in outside-the-box thinking and different therapies," Martin explains.

This time he was back in action and walking around after just four weeks, virtually pain-free. And it was thanks to the ROSA Knee System (Robotic Surgical Assistant), the team at Beacon and his commitment to recovery. ROSA assists surgeons at Memorial Hospital and Elkhart General Hospital by tailoring total knee replacement surgery to the patient's needs. The minimally invasive procedure can mean less time in the hospital, reduced pain and discomfort and less scaring.

And while the procedure made a world of difference for Martin, he's quick to credit the team at Beacon and the level of care he received for how well he's doing. "Dr. Ebersole hit a home run with ROSA. He and his team are the most phenomenal group I've ever seen."

Reaching higher in 2022

Although the Beacon Orthopedic Collaborative Care Program reached important milestones last year, we continue striving to improve care even more for our patients as we move forward. In 2022, we plan to:

- Continue to reduce care variations.
- Continue to expand our new CareSense digital platform to measure patient satisfaction with the Total Joint Replacement program.
- Continue to optimize pre-surgery initiatives such as helping diabetic patients to better control their HA1C levels, which creates fewer post-surgical complications and promotes faster recovery and better outcomes.
- Develop and implement enhanced recovery after surgery (ERAS) protocols such as helping patients improve their nutrition and fluid management and diabetic patients improve their HA1C levels.
- Continue to focus on standardizing physicians' admission and after-surgery order sets for treatment and care of hip-fracture patients to increase efficiency and achieve more consistent outcomes for patients.

- Increase use of tranexamic acid (TXA), a medication that reduces bleeding and lessens the need for transfusions during surgery, helping patients recover more quickly.
- Increase patients' movement after surgery, which reduces blood clots and speeds patient recovery.
- Continue efforts to reduce cost of care related to hip and knee replacements as well as hip fractures by implementing a recycle/refurbish program for nonimplantable surgical supplies.

Our Beacon Orthopedic Collaborative Care Program team and every dedicated Beacon associate is committed to clinical excellence and continuous improvement. We look forward to achieving these goals as we continue to provide the best orthopedic care possible to our community.
