Summary of Financial Assistance Policy

Beacon Allegan has a commitment to and respect for each person's dignity with a special concern for those who struggle with barriers to access healthcare services. Beacon Allegan has an equal commitment to manage its healthcare resources as a service to the entire community. In furtherance of these principles, Beacon Allegan provides financial assistance for certain individuals who receive emergency or other medically necessary care from Beacon Allegan. This summary provides a brief overview of Beacon Allegan's Financial Assistance Policy.

Who Is Eligible?

You may be able to get financial assistance if you live in Allegan County. Financial assistance is generally determined by your total household income as compared to the Federal Poverty Level. If your income is less than or equal to 2501% of the Federal Poverty Level, you may receive a 100% charity care write-off on the portion of the charges for which you are responsible. If your income is above 25013% of the Federal Poverty Level but does not exceed 4002% of the Federal Poverty Level, you may receive discounted rates on a sliding scale. If you have medical debt for emergency and medically necessary care that exceeds your income, you may be eligible for a discount. If you have assets in excess of 250% of your Federal Poverty Level income amount you may not qualify for financial assistance. Patients who are eligible for financial assistance will not be charged more for eligible care than the amounts generally billed to patients with insurance coverage.

What Services Are Covered?

The Financial Assistance Policy applies to emergency and other medically necessary care. These terms are defined in the Financial Assistance Policy. All other care is not covered by the Financial Assistance Policy.

How Can I Apply?

To apply for financial assistance, you typically will complete a written application and provide supporting documentation, as described in the Financial Assistance Policy and the Financial Assistance Policy application.³
